Use the suggested links in the assignment brochure for this class to learn how to use a template to set up a web page. In Photoshop- **IMPORTANT: Learn the Slice Tool and Slice Selection Tool Process to transfer your template to Dreamweaver and then to publish your web page to a local folder on your external storage to save the page. You must go into File, Publish entire site to add your path to your local folder. You can browse to do this. We will do this process in lab. You will then be able to place a gallery on your page.** Very simple but you have to do this to be able to locate your project the next time you visit it. This project is extremely important. These concepts are concepts that you must use to be successful in any field, but especially photography. You will not be required to set up an entire website. We are just going through a mock up process here. But this project will get you on your way to doing so. Please pay particular attention to your photographs. Be creative. Choose only your best photographs. Be organized and remember compositional rules. Take care to keep this site professional. Look at other photographer's websites to get a good start. I know this is most likely your first web page mockup, but that is no excuse to forget what you know. I am assigning this project well in advance, so ask now. Get your ideas together as soon as possible. Start with a template designed from your midterm project to exemplify cohesiveness. Pictures can be adjusted, edited and added or changed as you go.

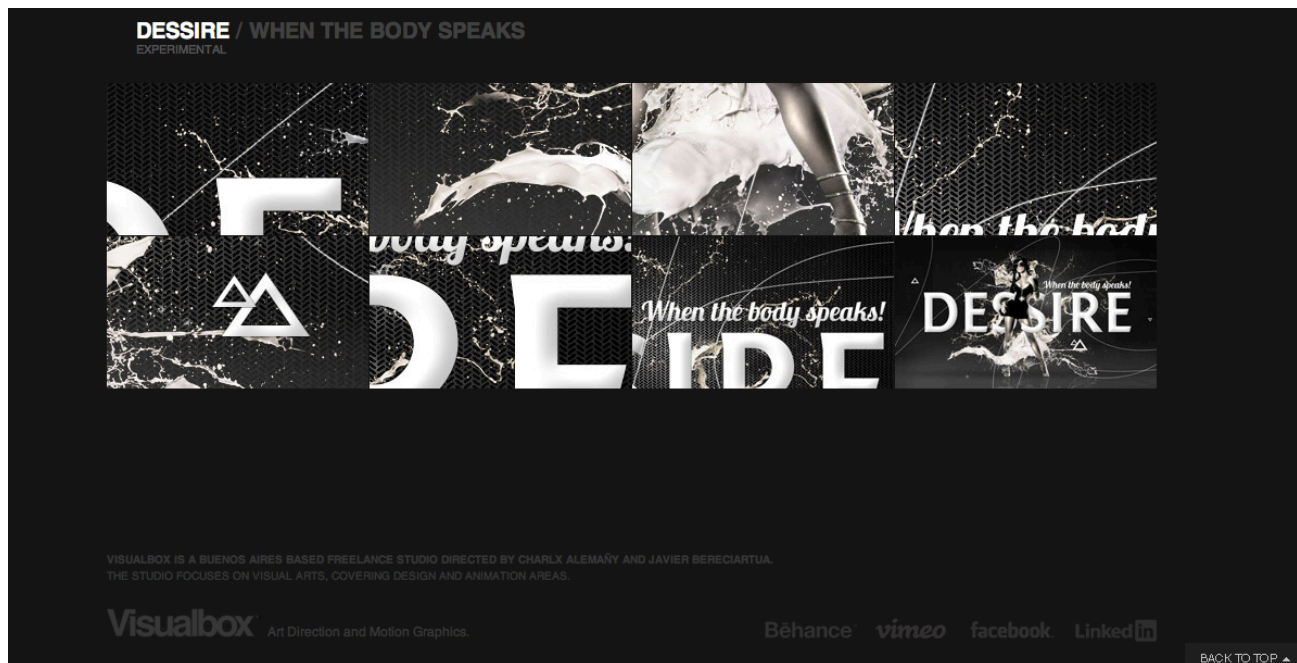

After transferring the sliced up page into Dreamweaver, you will have to code where necessary to implement your gallery plugin (your choice). Most Gallery extensions and plugins come with their own set of instructions, so you will have to implement these on your own. If you watched my tutorial suggestions in your assignment brochure this semester you are probably more than ready to implement this at this point. I want you to make this page interactive in at least two ways. Easy examples are click, hover and touch (pan). Once the page is complete, submit the entire folder to me on a burned DVD with a designed DVD cover and then upload it to your drop box and send me the public link to access it (Lesson in Lab). It is vital that you demonstrate the photography skills that you know. I expect you to carry this work into your future and continue on developing your own website. Good Luck!
